General Information (continued)

Protective Headgear- All exhibitors are required to wear properly fitting snug protective headgear on the show grounds when mounted. All juniors must wear ASTM Approved protective headgear with harness secured when mounted. The Sanctioning Associations encourages all riders to wear protective headgear passing or surpassing current applicable ASTM standards with harness secured while riding anywhere on the show grounds. It is the responsibility of the rider, parent, guardian, or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards and is in good condition and properly fitted.

<u>Conduct</u>- Any act of discourtesy to a Judge, Show Official, or staff member on the part of any trainer, owner, rider, or groom will immediately disqualify any horse with which they are associated and all entry fees will be forfeited. No refunds will be made.

Schooling- Schooling in the show rings without permission is prohibited at all times. Rings will be available for ticketed warm-up on Friday afternoon. The rings will also be available after the show each day and for limited schooling in the morning before the show. There will be no schooling over fences in the morning. Gate personnel have the authority to scratch riders who do not follow directions. Management may restrict schooling if conditions warrant.

Poling and Off-sets- Manual poling and the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing. Any rider, trainer, groom, or other person involved with poling or off-setting will be subject to a \$500 fine. Lunging- Lunging will be restricted to designated areas. There will be no lunging in show rings or schooling rings.

<u>Class Rules</u>- Classes shall be conducted in accordance with the Sanctioning Association. Open classes will be conducted in accordance with USEF guidelines.

Attire-Jackets will be worn for hunter and equitation classes. Tucked-in polo shirts can be worn in the jumper ring. For classics and medals, formal attire is required. In extremely warm conditions, for the safety of our competitors, jackets will be waived.

Eligibility- Ponies must have a GHJA or USEF measurement card to be presented at check-in. Three Minute Rule- The three-minute rule will be in effect at all times. Classes will be canceled if there is not a competitor in the ring within three minutes of the start of the time clock.

Courtesy Circle - Management may restrict the courtesy circle with a mandatory dotted line.

Holding Classes - Under no circumstances will a flat class or under saddle class be held for a trainer conflict, unless the conflict concerns the horse being in another ring. Equitation and jumper classes may, at management's discretion, follow a posted order of go. Management will designate priority rings daily. **Hunter Courses** - Courses shall simulate obstacles found in the hunt field such as coops, roll tops, natural rails,

gates, walls, etc. Hunter Classes - Hunter classes shall be judged on performance, manner and soundness. Under saddle classes

shall be walk, trot and canter. Equitation Classes - Equitation classes shall be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse.

Equitation Classes- Equitation classes shall be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse. **Jumper Classes**- Courses may consist of any combination of brush, gates, coops, roll tops, oxers, post and rails, walls, water, etc. Classes will be judged on time and soundness.

<u>Ties</u>- All ties involving first place will be jumped off. All ties not involving first place will be decided by time. <u>Champion and Reserve Champion</u>- To be awarded to the two horses with the most points in the division. Both will be awarded in classes in which at least three horses competed. To be eligible for Champion or Reserve competitor must the in the top four in over fences points. Point System: 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, 1/2

<u>**Prize Money-**</u> Prize money will automatically be deducted from your show bill. Overage checks will be mailed within 30 days of the show. Checks will not be issued without a valid social security number or federal identification number. In order to be eligible for prize money, the horse must be entered in at least one other class during the show day.

Add-backs: If classics are ran as add-backs, the pay outs will be 1st-40%, 2nd - 30%, 3rd-20%, 4th-10%. <u>Stakes Classes-</u>Must be entered in the entire division to be eligible payback. Adult Hunter, Children's Hunter, Pre-Childrens/Adult, Short Stirrup Hunter, Long Stirrup Hunter, Pony Hunter Payback: \$20, \$15, \$10, \$5.

Other Elite Rated Classes

Elite Schooling Hunter- Open to all horses, ponies, juniors, amateurs, and professionals eligible to jump 2'. Will be shown at 2'.

Elite Schooling Jumper- Open to all horses, ponies, juniors, amateurs, and professionals eligible to jump 2'6". Will be shown at 2'6".

<u>Walk/Trot</u> Open to riders in their first or second year of showing, who have not jumped over 18 inches. <u>Once/Twice Around</u>- for riders in their first or second year of showing and have not jumped over 18 inches. <u>Cross rail</u>-Riders must be in their first or second year of showing, and may never have shown over jumps larger than 18".

<u>Pre Hunter Rider</u>: for green horses. Horses that have not jumped over 2 feet. Open to riders in their first or second year of showing over fences not greater than 18". Courses will be simple verticals (no wider than a rail). Rider must declare one fence height. 18' or 2'

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, their horses, and their dogs. It is strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events, and to keep that policy up to date. If any damages occur to Elite Show Jumping Inc., its employees, agents, stalls, buildings, and other properties on the show ground, they will be billed accordingly. Elite Show Jumping Inc. (horse show management) reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions or concerns not covered, shall be decided by Elite Show Jumping Inc. (horse show management): its decision will be final. Elite Show Jumping Inc. (horse show management) reserves the right to limit entries in any class, section or division. Elite Show Jumping Inc. (horse show management) also reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entries, disgualify any riders or exhibitors, and cancel award prizes, without any claim to damages. (horse show management) reserves the right to change courses, add a dotted line, a three minute gate call, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, reschedule classes, change rings, rotate judges, change specifications of classes, after due notice to exhibitors as competition warrants. Every effort has been made to avoid mistakes in this publication, Elite Show Jumping Inc., and its management assume no liability to anyone for errors.

Entries- Stall reservations and entries will be taken on a first come, first serve basis. R.V Hook-ups are available upon request on entry forms for \$30.00 per night. No horse may participate in the event or be on the grounds without having a completed entry blank, including signatures acknowledging the agreement printed thereon. Horse show management is not responsible for entry errors due to incomplete or illegible entry forms. If one wants points to count toward GHJA end of the year, the owner's, horse's, and rider's GHJA numbers must be on the entry form. Owners and exhibitors are responsible for all horses and fees incurred by them or their agents, even though payment may not be submitted with entry. Parents or legal guardians of minor exhibitors will not hold Elite Show Jumping Inc. (horse show management), staff, or facilities responsible for any injury to such minor. No minor's entry will be accepted without the signature of a parent or legal guardian. Entry forms for each show must include horse's name. rider's name, all classes or divisions entered, ALL MANDATORY SIGNATURES, and social security or federal ID numbers of owners. Current negative coggins tests are required for admittance to the grounds. Entries received after the closing date will incur an additional fee of \$25.00 per horse. Refunds are given to entries with cancellation prior to the show, less a\$15.00 processing fee. A \$30.00 fee will be charged for returned checks. Upon notification, accounts will be given (5) five days to be paid in full. If not made agreeable in five days, sanctioning organizations will be notified for disciplinary repercussions. Additional fees such as a \$25.00 non-stabling fee or a \$25.00 non-showing fee will apply to those applicable. Both non-stabling horses and non-showing horses are expected to pay office and medic fees. Upon leaving an open signed check, exhibitors will receive their numbers. Any horse show bills not checked out at the conclusion of each show will be checked out by the horse show secretary. Any mistakes at check out must be resolved within 24 hours. Please check your bills carefully.

<u>Class Limits</u>—Horses and ponies may not enter more than seven over fences classes, including equitation and all special classes , such as classic classes in any one show day.

Stabling and Bedding- One horse/pony per stall; there will be no sharing of stalls. Shaving deliveries need to be made through the horse show office. There will be no Sunday deliveries. Trainers or agents need to check in with the horse show secretary to verify shavings count and stall splits.

Electrical/Fire Regulations- All electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. No Class I Flammable liquids such as gasoline are allowed in the buildings.

<u>Parking</u>- Please park in designated areas. Fire regulations prohibit all vehicles, including trailers, vans and passenger vehicles from being parked in stable area. Those parked in unauthorized spot will be subject to fines and towing of vehicle at owner's expense.

Motorized Vehicles/Golf Carts- Unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate motorized vehicle

of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles. on the competition grounds. Failure to abide by these

regulations will subject the exhibitor to suspension from the horse show. Please refer to USEF GR 1301.7..

Dogs- All dogs must be on a leash of no more than 6 feet in length, or otherwise contained, at all times while on

competition grounds. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Loose and/or disruptive dogs may be subject to impoundment by the horse show or by the local government. Owners of loose and/or disruptive dogs may be subject to penalties and/or fines under GHJA Rules 18 and 19. Warning cards may be issued to such dog owners, an accumulation of which shall result in further penalties.



GHJA Classes & Divisions

This horse show is a local member *Georgia Hunter Jumper Association, Inc.* and is operated in accordance with the current rules of GHJA. Every person who participates in the show is responsible for a knowledge of and subject to GHJA rules. The following classes/ divisions are GHJA recognized and points won in classes with three or more entries will count towards year-end high-score awards for those entries who are current members, and have a horse recording.

Open Hunter- Open to all horses and ponies. Open to all juniors, amateurs, and professionals. Will be shown at either 2'6" or 3'. Height is at rider's or trainer's discretion.

Pre-Children's Hunter- Open to Junior riders on horses or ponies; horse/rider combination may not have competed at 3'3" or higher at any Local or Regular Member horse show in the previous 3 years. Fence height 2'6".

Pre-Adult Hunter: Open to Adult Amateur riders on horse or ponies; horse/rider combination may not have competed at 3'3" or higher at any Local or Regular Member horse show in the previous 3 years. Fence height 2'6".

Children's Hunter- Open to juniors on horses. Will be shown at 3'.

Adult Amateur Hunter- Open to Adult Amateur riders on horses or ponies. A pony ridden in the Adult Amateur Hunters may not cross enter into any Pony Hunter division or Junior Equitation division or Junior Medal at the same show. Will be shown at 3'. Adult Amateur Equivation- Open to amateurs, eighteen or over, on horses. Will be shown at 3'.

GINA Addition (Gine to anateurs, eighteen or over, on horses, white a source of GHJA Addith Medal-Open to anateurs, eighteen or over, on horses, who are current GHJA members. Will be shown at 3' over a modifiedjumper type course of at least eight fences. There will be at least one over, and one change of direction. A minimum of six riders, if available, will be called back for a flat phase which counts as 25%. The judge may ask riders to perform USEF tests 1-19. Three horses must complete both phases in order for points to count towards end of the year.

Green Working Hunter-Open to horses in their first or second year of showing. Open to juniors, amateurs, and professionals. First year green will be shown at 3'. Second year green will be shown at 3'3".

<u>Modified Hunter</u> – Open to all horses, ponies, juniors, amateurs, and professionals eligible to jump 2'9". Will be shown at 2'9". <u>Short Stirrup Hunter</u> - Open to riders ages 12 years and under, on horses or ponies, in their first or second year of showing over fences higher than 18" in any hunter show. NOTE: Participation in once around-twice around or beginner and crossrail classes will not count as part of these two years as long as the jump height does not exceed 18". A rider on a pony may cross-enter only into Schooling Pony (2' only) and age group equitation, not to include any medal classes. A rider on a horse may cross enter only into Pre Children's Hunter(2'6" only) and age group equitation, not to include any medal classes. Riders may enter non-recognized classes where fence heights d on to exceed 2" for ponies and 2'6" for horses. Riders may not enter "under saddle" or "flat" classes that do not fall within these parameters. Riders may show in Short Stirrup classes for two consecutive years. Fence height 2'.

Short Stirrup Equitation- Open to qualified Short Stirrup riders 12 and under. Will be shown at 2'.

11 & Under Equitation- Open to juniors, age eleven and under, on horses or ponies. Will be shown at 2'.

Long Stirrup Hunter- Open to Amateur and Junior riders, 13 years of age and older, on horses or ponies in their first or second year of showing over fences higher than 18" in any hunter show. NOTE: Participation in once around-twice around or

beginner and crossrail classes will not count as part of these two years as long as the jump height does not exceed 18". Adult riders who are reentering the show ring after an absence cannot have shown over fences higher than 2'6" in the past 5 years.

Riders may compete in this division no more than two consecutive years. The two years of long stirrup eligibility are continuous show calendar years that cannot be separated or divided in any manner. A rider may cross enter only into Hunter

divisions and age group equitation at the same show if fence height does not exceed 2'6", not to include any medal classes. Riders may enter non-recognized classes where fence heights do not exceed 2'6". Riders may not enter "under saddle" or "flat" classes that do not fall within these parameters. Fence height 2'3".

Long Stirrup Equitation- Open to qualified Long Stirrup riders. Will be shown at 2'3".

15-17 Equitation- Open to juniors, between the ages of fifteen and seventeen on horses or ponies. Will be shown at 3'. JD Pounds Medal- Open to juniors on horses who are current GHJA members. Will be shown at 3' over a modified-jumper type course of at

least eight fences. There will be at least one oxer, and one change of direction. A minimum of six riders, if available, will be called back for a flat phase which counts as 25%. The judge may ask riders to perform USEF tests 1-19. Three entries must complete both phases in order for points to count towards end of the year prizes.

12-14 Equitation- Open to juniors, between the ages of twelve and fourteen on horses or ponies. Will be shown at 2'6"

Pony Divisions- All pony over fences classes will be set on a 12 foot stride.

GHJA Ponv Medal- Open to juniors on ponies, who are current GHJA members. Will be shown at 2' for small, 2'3" for medium ponies; and 2'9" for large ponies. It will be over a modified-jumper type course of at least eight fences. There will be at least one oxer, and one change of direction. A minimum of six riders, if available, will be called back for a flat phase which counts as 25%. The judge may ask riders to perform USEF tests 1-19. Three entries must complete both phases in order for points to count towards end of the year prizes. The GHJA Pony Medal may be run concurrently with the Pony Hunter divisions and the flat phase then held immediately following the pony hunter under saddle classes. The under saddle performance of a minimum of six riders, if available, shall count 25%. Alternatively, the GHJA Pony Medal may be run concurrently with the Pony Hunter divisions and in lieu of a flat phase, two tests from USEF Tests 1 – 9 (see Appendix B) must be included in the over fences performance. Three entries must complete the over fences and testing requirements for qualification points to count Schooling Pony- Open to juniors on ponies. Will be shown at 2' and 2'6''. Height is at rider's or trainer's discretion.

Small Pony Hunter- Open to juniors 12 or younger on ponies that do not exceed 12.2 hands. Will be shown at 2'.

Medium Pony Hunter- Open to juniors 14 or under on ponies that are over 12.2 hands, but do not exceed 13.2 hands. Will be shown at 2'3". Large Pony Hunter- Open to juniors on ponies that are over 13.2 hands, but do not exceed 14.2 hands. Will be shown at 2,9". Low Schooling Jumper- Open to horses and ponies. Open to juniors, anateurs, and professionals. Will be shown at 3'.

Child Jumper- Open to juniors on horses or ponies. Will be shown at 3'-3'3".

Adult Jumper- Open to adults on horses or ponies. Will be shown at 3'-3'3"

High Schooling Jumper- Open to horses and ponies. Open to juniors, amateurs, and professional. Will be shown at 3'6".

GHJA Junior's Equitation Challenge – Open to all Junior and Adult Amateur GHJA members on horses or ponies. To be judged at a walk, trot, and canter. Competitors will be asked to perform at least two of the following USEF tests chosen by the Judge: #1-Halt; #2-Hand gallop; #9- Ride without stirrups; #15-Change leads on a line demonstrating a simple or flying change of lead; #17- Canter on the counter lead. Martingales are not permitted. Riders receiving outside assistance or coaching while in the arena will be eliminated. Riders who have worn the Final Junior's Equitation Challenge in 2009 - 2011 are no longer eligible to compete in this class. November 1st is the cut off date for riding in qualifying classes at shows. The top 20 riders who have accumulated points throughout the year will qualify to ride in the Final Phase of the Challenge at the GHJA Finals Horse Show. In the Final Phase riders will be asked to perform any two or more of the USEF tests 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14, 15, 17 & 18. The judge will then require the top 4 riders to switch horses (USEF test #16) and perform any two or more tests that were previously ridden.

Modified Hunter- Open to all horses, ponies, juniors, amateurs, and professionals eligible to jump 2'9". Will be shown at 2'9".
